Based on operating 3 canals and serving 90% of our permitted acres (41,026.5)with an allocation of water in 2016



2015 WATER ADMINISTRATION

December 2014

•DNR issues final forecast and declares 2015 a "Compact Call Year" Estimated Two-Year Total (2014/2015) = (17,600) AF

• January 1, 2015

•DNR issues closing notices to all natural flow permits and storage permits. *(Including Reclamation Reservoirs)*

2015 WATER ADMINISTRATION

• March 6, 2015

•Nebraska and Kansas signed one year agreement on how Nebraska will supply Kansas water for 2015 from Stream augmentation. (N-CORPE)

•Surface water permits previously closed will be reinstated effective February 26, 2015 and will not be closed prior to September 15th 2015.

2015 WATER ADMINISTRATION

Nebraska agrees to assign the 17,600 AF pumped from N-CORPE to a Kansas storage account in Harlan County Reservoir.

(No adjustment for transit lost)

2016 WATER ADMINISTRATION • 2016 has been declared a "Compact Call Year" by DNR

2015 Balance = (14,200) AF 2016 Forecast = (38,800) AF Total Forecasted Compact Shortfall = (53,000)

2016 WATER ADMINISTRATION • November 24, 2016

Nebraska and Kansas signed a one year agreement to provide Kansas with 40,000 acre-feet in Harlan County by June 1, 2016

NRDs are obligated to provide 33,000 Acre-feet from N-CORPE!



2016 WATER ADMINISTRATION November 30, 2016

DNR- Order sent to Reclamation <u>asking</u> them to Store 100% of the inflow into Harlan County Reservoir for the State of Kansas.

DNR also closed Reclamation's storage use permits on Nebraska Bostwick acres during December.




2015 FCID Summary

FCID 2016 WATER SUPPLY

Based on the current Reservoir contents: Meeker-Driftwood Canal = January Announcement (Will depend on January Surface Water Administration by DNR)

Red Willow Canal = 0 inches per acre.

Bartley Canal = January Announcement (Will depend on January Surface Water Administration by DNR)

Cambridge Canal = 8 inches per acre

Note: Reclamation will make a final estimate to the Board of Directors by January 15, 2015

FCID 2016 WATER SUPPLY

The water toll for 2016 is:

\$5.00 per acre for every permitted Acre (45,669 Acres)

Plus \$49.50 per Acre-foot allocated (\$4.125 per inch)

PROPOSED IMP MODIFICATIONS

Nebraska told the U.S. Supreme Court that it would reduce groundwater pumping by 25% of the baseline by 2015.

2 of the 3 NRDs did not achieve that requirement by the end of 2015.

All 3 Natural Resource Districts recently held hearings on proposed changes to the IMPs.

One change is to reduce the 25% reduction currently required to 20% reduction.

PROPOSED IMP MODIFICATIONS

Frenchman Cambridge and the United States Bureau of Reclamation provided testimony at all three hearings in opposition to these changes.

The NRDs will vote on adopting these changes at their January board meeting.

The DNR Director (Jeff Fassett) will also need to approve these changes.

WATER USERS LAWSUIT UPDATE!

Background:

- 1. A lawsuit was filed against the State of Nebraska and DNR on July 31, 2014 by water users of FCID
- 2. The State filed a Motion to Dismiss. The Court sustained the original Dismissal Motion and granted leave to amend the pleading to cure a deficit.

WATER USERS LAWSUIT UPDATE!

An Amended Complaint asserted:

- 1. Nebraska took from FCID water users' surface water to which the water users and FCID had a priority right to water use under the law.
- Nebraska failed to responsibly monitor and limit groundwater pumping from the Aquifer. As a result, underground waters of the Republican River Basin were diminished and stream flows were directly influenced by excessive pumping.

The State filed another dismissal motion.

- The Court overruled the State's position taking issue with our contention that surface water available to FCID and its water users was deprived from them. This Claim was allowed to proceed in Court.
- 2. The Court rejected the argument that excessive groundwater pumping occurred.

The ruling in favor of FCID water users is a major victory for FCID water users.

The State has again asked the Court to reconsider its ruling in favor of FCID water users.

This hearing will occur on January 14, 2016 in Dawson County.

After the favorable ruling from the District Court in the 2013 case, a 2014 Crop Year lawsuit was filed on October 30, 2015.

The second case mirrors the first case and the State's response mirrors its position in the 2013 case.

The State Motion responding to the Complaint will be heard at the Jan. 14, 2016 hearing in Dawson County.

Mr. Domina is optimistic for crop producers who are Plaintiffs in the 2013 case and equally optimistic about the 2014 case.

Admittedly, we are asking the District Court to take steps not taken by Nebraska Courts before, but this is because a lawsuit like the two that have been filed have not appeared in the courts before.

2016 Election for Division #1 February 2, 2016

New definition in State Statutes for an "Elector" Electors will need to establish themselves as an Elector by January 3, 2016.
